**No Current Flood Watches or Warnings**

**North:** Air stagnation advisory until Sunday with a dense fog advisory through today including freezing fog. High 36, Low 30. **Tomorrow:** Similar weather to today.

**North Central Idaho:** Fog in the morning then partly sunny. High 40s and Low 30s. **Tomorrow:** Fog with increase with possibility of freezing fog. High 40s and Low 30s.

**Southwestern Idaho:** Dense fog for the morning. High 36 and Low 27. Warmer temperatures in the mountains compared to the valleys. **Tomorrow:** Similar weather to today.

**Central Idaho:** Mostly cloudy with High 46 and Low 29 **Tomorrow:** Partly sunny with High 42 and Low 23.

**Eastern Idaho:** Widespread haze with a freezing fog advisory. High 35 and Low 25. **Tomorrow:** Fog advisory with dropping temperatures. High 32 and Low 13.

**A1. 01/13/09, 1335** The IDEOC has received the signed and completed Disaster Project Agreement back from Benewah County. This project agreement is for ice breaking on the St Joe River.

**\*Action Stage**

The stage which, when reached by a rising stream, represents the level where the NWS or a partner/user needs to take some type of mitigation action in preparation for possible significant hydrologic activity.

**\*Flood Stage**

An established gage height for a given location above which a rise in water surface level begins to create a hazard to lives, property, or commerce. The issuance of flood (or in some cases flash flood) warnings is linked to flood stage. Not necessarily the same as bankfull stage.

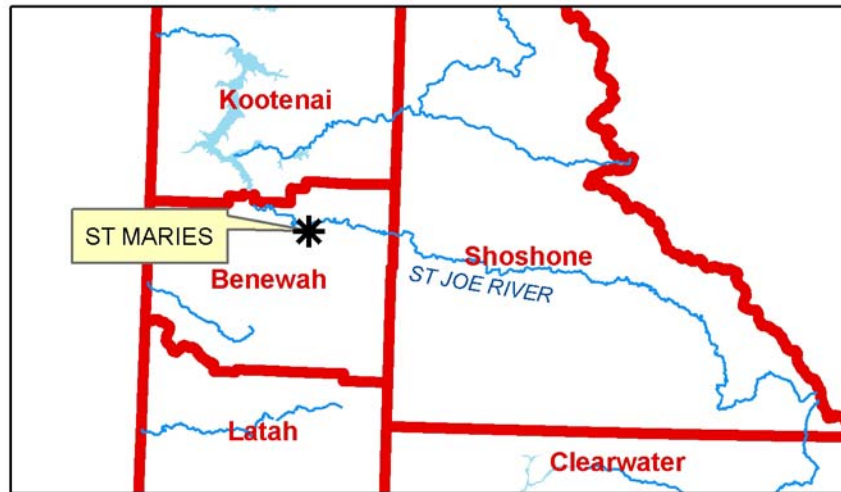
